## PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1991



*Ladies and Gentlemen,*

It gives me great pleasure to present to you the Annual Report of the Association ending 31st December 1991.

Throughout the year the children were invited to numerous parties many of which were arranged by their generous Foster Parents. On the whole the Association enjoyed a busy and successful year.

### **FINANCE**

I wish to report that the financial position of the Association is sound. The year ended most satisfactorily with an excess of income over expenditure of \$97,440.95. This was once again largely due to the philanthropy of the public and various corporations in Penang as well as the commendable efforts of our Vice President Mr. V.S. Bastion, who raised \$256,695.47 through the Foster Parents Appeal Scheme. We wish to thank him for his fine efforts and all Foster Parents for their kind and continued generous support.

We are also very grateful for the annual grant of \$64,898.00 from the Ministry of Welfare Services. \$32,566.55 of this subsidy from the Ministry helped to pay the salaries of our teachers.

Salaries and allowances for our thirty-three staff amounted to \$180,269.00 and this continued to be the bulk of a rising expenditure.

### **VOLUNTEER SERVICE ABROAD**

Our Spastic Centre is still short of qualified therapists to give adequate training to our Spastic children. Repeated advertisements in the newspapers had not been met with any response. We are therefore compelled to appeal to foreign service organisations for assistance. Through Miss Anne Thomas of Australian Volunteers Abroad, the Spastic Centre obtained the services of Miss Rhonda Mitchell, an occupational therapist. Through the help of Mr. Chris Hawley of the New Zealand Volunteer Service Abroad, Miss Lorena Handley, a Special Education Teacher joined the Spastic Centre on 1st March 1991. We are beholden to Miss Anne Thomas, Mr. Chris Hawley and their organisations for the support and continuous sponsorship of volunteers to help our staff at the Centre.

### **CHANGES**

The year 1991 was most eventful. The Association experienced a greater turnover of staff but fortunately it was also able to recruit the personnel required to fill the vacancies.

On 1st June 1991 Mr. Foong See Yoke resigned from his post as Executive Administrator of the Spastic Centre and he was replaced by Mr. Hudson H.H. Lee. To those who had left their posts either by retirement or by resignation, I would like to convey my appreciation for their good work and best wishes for the future.

## FUND RAISING

In view of the increasing number of children seeking places in this Centre, there is an urgent need to increase the working space at the Spastic Centre to accommodate them. Towards this end the Association had launched the following Fund Raising projects such as :

1. *Selling of Bricks*
2. *Charity Dinner*
3. *Appeals for donations*


to realise the sum of \$500,000.00 for this building expansion at the Spastic Centre.

## STAFF

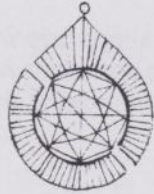
There continued to be staff resignations for reasons of furthering their educations at tertiary institutions and getting a better paying job.

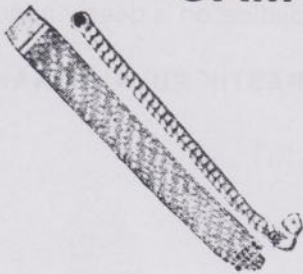

## MEDICAL

The Association was sad to lose the services of Dr. Charles Ong Ewe Chye (1.9.91) and Dr. Wee Ch'ng Keow Hiang (1.12.91) as Medical Advisers after many years of dedicated and unpretentious service to the Centre.

Dr. Charles Ong Ewe Chye had never failed to see any child that was sent to him for treatment. His Polyclinic at 46 Kinta Lane was practically an open house for our children. He will be greatly missed and the Association wishes him and his family all the best in their new life in Australia.

Dr. Wee Ch'ng Keow Hiang, in spite of her busy schedule, managed to do monthly reviews of the children's progress with the staff for more than seventeen years. The vacuum left by her will be doubly hard to fill. She will always be in the hearts of the children and staff. The Association wishes her a happy life in her new country and extends her a warm welcome whenever she is back in Penang.

The Association is pleased to have the services of Dr. Yee Thiam Sun and Dr. Alex Lim Kheng Seng as new Medical Advisers. Dr. Yee Thiam Sun has been quietly and unpretentiously serving the Association for many years now in looking after the children's hearing problems. The Association is grateful he has graciously consented to be one of our Medical Advisers.

The Association is also thankful to Dr. Alex Lim Kheng Seng who is giving preferential treatment to the children. Dr. Alex Lim is also reviewing new cases together with Datuk Dr. Tan Ewe Aik.

Datuk Dr. Tan Ewe Aik is not only one of the Association's Medical Advisers, but he is also a Trustee as well. The Association is deeply grateful to Datuk Dr. Tan Ewe Aik for his long years of service with the Centre.

Last, but not least, the Association is deeply grateful to Mrs. Ong Kim Chye for her voluntary service to the Centre as a qualified nurse. Every Wednesday, without fail, Mrs. Ong Kim Chye would prepare the Centre's "clinic" and help in looking after the health of our children as well as in the examination of new cases.

Out of the number of children reviewed by our Medical Advisers, 22 of them were admitted as "Therapy Clients". These new additions had raised the number of therapy clients to a high of 47. It is hoped with the new building extension, these children will be absorbed into the mainstream care of the Centre.

Eight children were discharged for various reasons. Two of the three discharged due to reaching the maximum age found jobs at one of the factories in Bayan Lepas. One child, Mohd. Haniff, passed away during the year. The Association extends deepest condolences to the parents.

## INTRODUCTORY CLASS 1

In 1991 there were only 4 children in this class with ages ranging from 6 - 10 years. These children were admitted into this class from Pre-Entry (Afternoon) session. Lessons were introduced to them through fun and play approach. The children were taught sandplay, hydrotherapy, outdoor games and were taken for educational visits to places of interest.

## INTRODUCTORY CLASS 2

An individual Education Plan was set up according to the child's needs and abilities. Each programme was aimed at giving the child as wide a range of experience / education as possible. The children were taken to different places to create awareness of different environments. Home visits were made whenever necessary.

## PRE-SCHOOL

There were 6 children in this class in 1991. Lessons were planned according to individual abilities and needs.

Through the Multi-Sensory Programme (a programme involving academic work and skill related activities) the children were taught to increase their independence.

## SCHOOL SECTION

The school section with a total of 18 students is divided into three classrooms namely Merah, Hijau and Biru. The K.B.S.R. system of education is followed as closely as possible, but it is up to the respective teachers to make their lessons flexible to suit each student's ability.

Subjects taught includes Bahasa Malaysia, English, Alam Perdagangan, Alam dan Manusia (Man and Environment), Mathematics and Pendidikan Moral. Cooking classes are also held beside the academic subject to help mould these students to be useful and independent people.

## CO-CURRICULUM ACTIVITIES

### Cubs

Our cub pack had a total of 7 members this year. Their ages range from 10 years to 14 years old and as in previous years they took part in various activities such as :

1. First aid - learning how to clean and dress a simple wound, tying a reef knot, etc.
2. Flag -
  - a. Malaysian
  - b. State Flags
3. Craft work - Making book marks, drawing etc.
4. Learning the rules of being a cub
5. Social skills -
  - a. Making a simple drink
  - b. Singing and games session with girl guides, brownies and scouts.

### Sea Scouts

There were 7 members in the Sea Scouts movement. As in previous years the Sea Scouts took part in various activities and were taught some simple first aid, water safety and pioneering apart from singing, marching and flag raising exercises. They were also exposed to camping during the school holidays.

### Girl Guides

The Girl Guides Company consisted of 5 girls. as in previous years they participated in various programmes that were planned for their training.

The guides improved themselves through the Guide Laws and Promise. They were also taught to make and recognise different knots.

All of them did well during a cooking session where they learnt fire-lighting and basic cooking skills. In addition they also learnt some basic origami (paper folding) activities from the volunteers who came to help them.

### Brownies

The 14th South District Brownies Pack had a total of 7 new brownies who were recruited early in the year.

- the Mac Donalds fast food restaurant
- Gurney Drive (to collect sea shells for the class aquarium)



## **THERAPEUTIC CLASS**

9 children received training at the Therapeutic Class during the year. The aim of this class is to prepare them emotionally, socially and physically to develop independent living skill.

Emphasis has been on teaching work skills, which will help the student to find open or sheltered employment. To prepare them, practical activities are taught, such as, basketry, sewing, embroidery, woodwork, contract work and domestic science together with activities of daily living.

More emphasis on community integration was carried out, like using public transport, public telephone, going to supermarkets and eating in public restaurants or stalls.

Once a week the students are given the opportunity to go to the Federation School for the Deaf to interact with the students there, at the same time to learn skills in woodwork and hair dressing.

During the year 2 students successfully found employment at McDonald as a general worker and the other one at Bengkal Sains Suria

## **ON JOB TRAINING**

3 students are still on job training - 2 in Job-link where various contract work are carried out before they are emplaced. One student is still under training in the factory (MDEC SDN. BHD.)

## **OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY**

Approximately 48 children received occupational therapy during the year. Students were seen individually as well as in groups for half to one hour between one to three times a week depending on their needs.

The aims of Occupational therapy for these students were independence in self-care, increased memory and cognitive skills and increased sensory motor functions.

Equipment were made, modified and adapted to serve students to meet their individual goals. Home visits were made to help students in toileting, bathing and feeding problems.

Life education was introduced to students who were 13 years and above. This move helped the students to understand the function of their bodies and physiological changes through life and meaning of having Cerebral Palsy.

## SPECIAL NEEDS UNIT

The Special Needs Unit has a total of 14 students at the moment. The ages of the students range from 3 to 10 years old. The main aim of this unit is to help children with slow development due to Cerebral Palsy.

Group sessions for two to three hours once or twice a week depending on their needs are carried out.

The aims of the special Needs Unit for these students are to acquire self-help skills enabling the students to meet basic life needs; learning general cognitive competence and ability to acquire new behaviours, perceptions and apply experiences to new situations.

Specific aims are set for each child according to his age and capabilities.

Some of the activities that were carried out with the students of S.N.U. are Hydrotherapy, feeding to achieve independence, basic communication skills, speech, music, fun and games, fine motor skills and Physio. All these are adapted to suit each individual student.

## SPEECH THERAPY

During the year 44 children received speech therapy, 29 of them attended the morning session. 15 in the afternoon session and 16 as therapy clients on a monthly basis.

Students were seen individually as well as in groups for half an hour between once to twice a week, depending on their needs.

This department trains the children in many forms of communication. This is to enable each child to enjoy inter-communication skills with others important to him / her.

These methods include hand signs, picture boards, gestures, speech, lip reading, facial expressions and word charts.

Many have undergone hearing assessment at Choong Dispensary where Dr. Yee Thiam Sun assesses their hearing loss and gives advice for future management of deaf persons.

As in previous years, Dr. Derrick Chan of Top Hearing Centre has continued to service the hearing aids used within the school.

## PHYSIOTHERAPY

A total of 100 students attended physiotherapy this year. 50% of these students were severely and multiply disabled. These students could only attend physiotherapy sessions because the other sections - occupational and speech could not cope due to lack of manpower in their respective sections.

Integration of therapies as in our school has an advantage. This type of team work helps to maintain the level of function of a child in a manner in which daily activities are performed serving as a continuous treatment. The way the patient moves in sitting, dressing himself, standing from sitting, walking and climbing stairs will help to reduce spasticity, maintain and even improve the standard one has reached.
