## **Building Extension Project**

The Building Extension had been completed and the Occupation Certificate had been applied for. It was expected that we would soon be moving into the new extension building consisting of very spacious Physiotherapy Hall and a Sheltered Workshop, Audio-Visual Room, Library, a customised kitchen and a Snoozland Room for children.

## **Upgrading Service Quality**

The main aim of the Association had been to upgrade the quality and excellence of its service from time to time and for this reason another physiotherapist and occupational therapist would be engaged. The practice of providing Excellence Awards to deserving staff would continue in the future.

## **Investment in Human Resources**

More deserving staff would be nominated for professional courses at home and abroad to provide a pool of qualified personnel to serve the Association at key departments. It is my intention that such an investment of Human Resources will continue.

## **Staff**

Throughout the year the Spastic Association of Penang experienced turnover of staff but it was able to recruit sufficient people to fill the various vacancies.

The financial position of the Association remains very sound. The year 1996 ended on a very satisfactory note with income exceeding expenditure. This was mainly due to the very hard work carried out by the Fund Raising Sub-Committee as well as the generous support from the caring public and business corporations in Penang. The Foster Parents Appeal continued to attract many contributions.


## Future Directions

# The Centre Administrator's Report



The year under review has been a particularly busy one. Through out the year both students and staff were involved in numerous activities and functions which took place not only within but also outside the centre.

This year saw the introduction of electric wheelchairs for wheelchair-bound students who have difficulties in manoeuvring the manual wheelchairs. Thanks to modern technology at least some of our students can now feel as though they are on a "racing circuit" ! These electric wheelchairs are immensely popular with the students who are using them and they have proved to be a great asset to their mobility and independence.

Earlier in the year our sports teacher together with our physiotherapist recommended the renovation of the centre's swimming pool to meet the requirements for teaching the Halliwick Swimming method. To mark the opening ceremony of the renovated pool the staff were given a two day workshop on the Halliwick Swimming method by Mr Joseph Pragasam and U Kyaw Myint. The Halliwick method is designed for use with children with disabilities and as a result of its implementation the water skills and confidence of the students have increased remarkably.

I must congratulate Mrs Helen Rajoo, our senior teaching assistant, who successfully completed the Advanced Certificate in Community Services (Disability) course held in Teluk Intan. Helen was also recognised for her remarkable long service at the centre by the Rotary club Of Penang, who gave her the Outstanding Citizen award of 1996.

Mrs Diana Leong was selected to participate in an exchange programme on Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment of the Disabled in Japan. This programme was sponsored by the Japanese Association for Employment of the Disabled. Her eight weeks in Japan gave Diana an opportunity to observe disabled people in both open and sheltered employment. She has returned with a wealth of new ideas for successful employment for the students once they leave the centre.

This year's SCAP staff Award for Excellence went to Mr Joseph Pragasam, Puan Azlina Azral and Mrs Shanti Jeganathan. Syabas to all of you and keep up the good work.

The long service award went to Madam Lee Poh Keat who has served the centre for 25 years. It is a distinct privilege to congratulate her on her 25 years of service at SCAP. Congratulations Poh Keat.

My sincere appreciation goes to all the staff for their contributions and commitment towards the development and success of the centre. Your tireless effort and dedication are commendable.

Finally gratitude is also due to the many Foster Parents, companies, hotels and generous individuals who have shown their continuous support for the centre through donations, parties for the children and services rendered at the Centre. Such contributions are not only necessary for the maintenance and growth of the Centre, but also bring much happiness and motivation to the children.

A total of ten children were discharge in 1996. Of this one left on attaining the maximum age, nine left due to parents on job transfer.

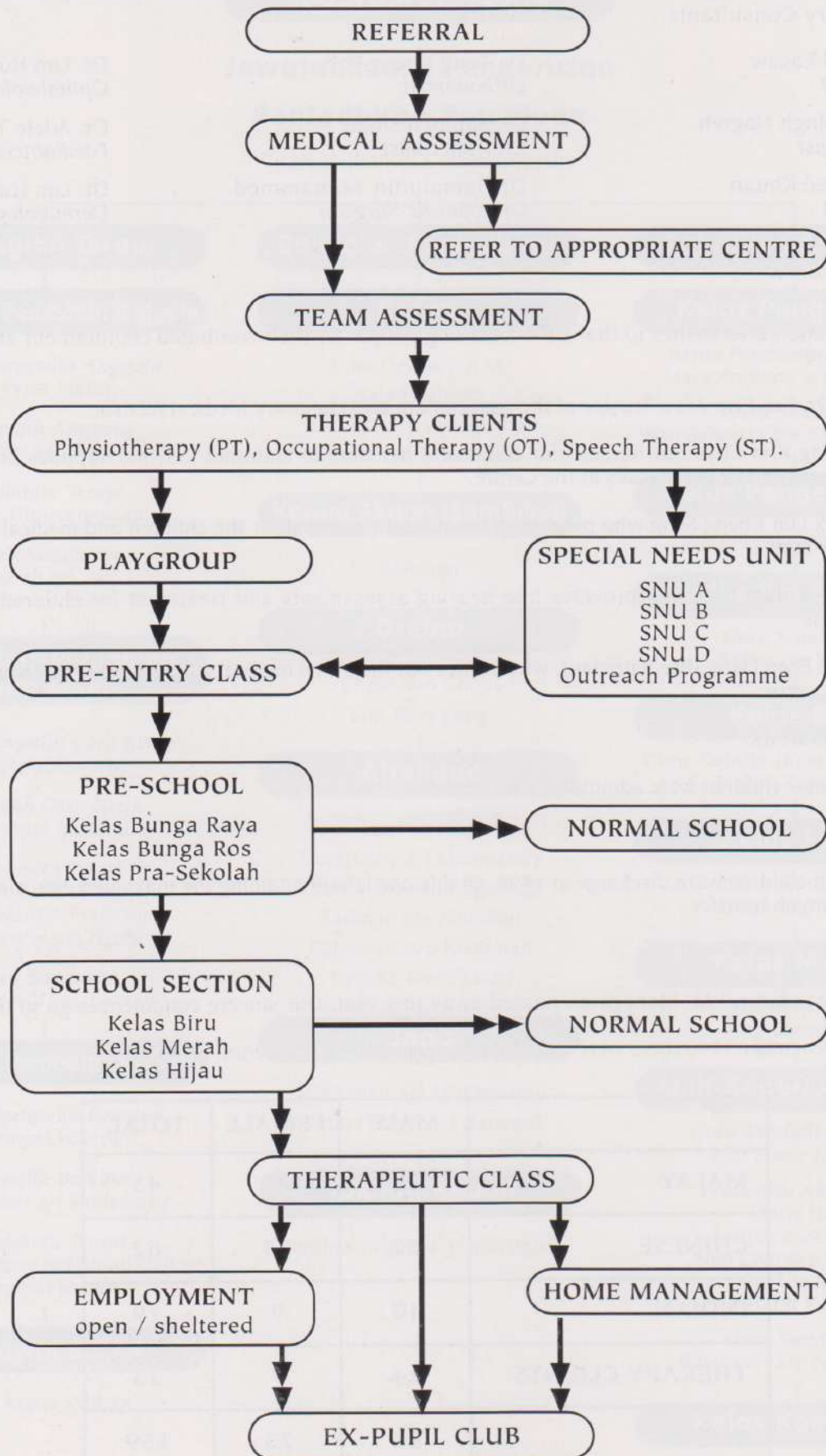
## **Deceased**

# PROGRESS CHART



## SCHOOL SECTION

18 pupils were enrolled in this section and they were placed in classes according to their abilities, namely Kelas Merah, Kelas Hijau dan Kelas Biru. Each pupil has his/her own Individual Educational Plan, so as to enable them to progress at their own pace.

Kelas Merah follows closely the regular school education with modifications to suit the needs of pupils. Pupils in this class will be potential UPSR candidates. Kelas Hijau dan Kelas Merah concentrates more on the practical aspects of learning.

Besides the academic curriculum, other activities such as swimming, gardening, music therapy, cooking, vocational skills, recycling projects (cards, bookmarkers) and activities of daily living continues to be an integral part of the training. During the year the pupils were also taken to visit places of interest, such as Public Service Departments and shopping complexes which comes under 'Lawatan Sambil Belajar' project. This holistic approach will eventually enable them to develop skills for future integration into community.

## **PRE SCHOOL SECTION**

This section is divided into 3 classes i.e. Kelas Bunga Raya, Kelas Bunga Ros and Pre School. These three classroom cater for children between 6-12 years of age. The children are usually promoted from the Pre-Entry class and placed according to their age.

Specific goals are prepared for each child to grade their abilities to master their skills in certain areas and uplift their learning abilities. Each classroom caters for 6-8 children. Lessons presented in these classroom are taught in play manner and practical experience are exposed. Basic concepts such as colours, number skills, English, Bahasa Malaysia, Mathematics and Music are gradually introduced for each child as they are promoted from one class to another. Electric typewriters and rubber stamps are used by children who are unable to write. Tables and chairs are modified whenever necessary. Home visit, hearing and vision test are carried out whenever necessary.

## **PRE SCHOOL AFTERNOON SESSION**

Young children attend afternoon session where they are divided into two groups depending on their ability and age. They are Early Intervention Mickey Playgroup and the Pre Entry Class. These classes are held on alternate basis between 2.00 pm - 4.00 pm from Monday to Thursday.

## **EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMME (EIP)**

In this Early Intervention Programme (EIP) named Mickey Playgroup, we work with young children aged 0 - 4 years. In this group, activities are largely based on sensory where therapists, parents and teachers work together. We found that parents are keen on this programme because we have regular attendance and full participation.

## PRE ENTRY CLASS

Children in Pre Entry class are taught nursery level skills which prepare them to be promoted later into our fulltime morning programme. The teacher to child ratio is 1 : 2. This is to ensure the child gets individualised attention. Multi-disciplinary team reviews are done on individual basis when necessary. During their time in Pre Entry the children also attend various therapy sessions mainly physiotherapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy.

Students are also promoted into normal kindy from Pre-entry.

The 14th South District Brownies Pack has a total of five Brownies. The Brownies session is carried out once a week for an hour which consists of various planned activities. The five Brownies have passed the "Pra-Persetiaan" badge and are preparing for the "Calit Emas" badge. As part of the activity they have visited a number of interesting places.

# SPECIAL NEEDS UNIT

The special Needs Unit comprises of 5 classes which make up to total of 68 children. Three groups of these students numbering 44 are placed in SNU A, B and C while the remaining 24 are seen on an Outreach Programme in Penang Island as well as Butterworth and Bukit Mertajam. Their ages range from 7 years - 18 years. The main aim of this unit is to help these students acquire basic skills in activities of daily living.

Specific aims are set for each students according to his age and capabilities. Most of our activities are focused in sensory stimulation, practical and eye-hand coordination skills.

# THERAPEUTIC CLASS

PHYSIOTHERAPY

6 students received training in the Therapeutic Class. This class aims to prepare students for adult life, emotionally, socially and physically and to develop independent living skills. The promotion of group interaction and the development of self awareness, self confidence and a sense of responsibility are also our objectives.

Practical Skills, such as sewing, making greeting cards from recycling papers and domestic science are taught. The emphasis on teaching home management skills are still carried out. These includes cooking, baking, ironing, washing, marketing and household tasks as well as personal skills such as dressing and grooming.

Once a week practical situations were also provided for the students in community integration. They are taught how to use public transport. Gardening is still very much part of the training and so far the students have planted variety of fruits and vegetables. This year flowers were also planted for 'press flower' for greeting cards.

Twice a week a student was sent to 'Glashaus' to learn some skills such as copying of picture and soldering glass.

# PHYSIOTHERAPY

A total 127 students receive physiotherapy throughout the year. From the school and pre school section there were 37 students in the morning and 9 in the afternoon. From the special needs unit classes 26 students came in the morning and 16 in the afternoon. A total of 36 students received physiotherapy as therapy clients. Under the outreach programme physiotherapy service was contributed to 17 children (6 from Penang Island and 11 from mainland). On every Tuesday and Thursday afternoons physiotherapy in the form of play activity is catered to 15 children from the Mickey Playgroup. Physiotherapy was also extended to children that comes under the mainland outreach programme, periodically.

The swimming pool was enlarged and modified to introduce the Halliwick Method for hydrotherapy and to train the disabled to swim progressively. A workshop on Halliwick Method was conducted for the staff by the physiotherapist. The physiotherapy unit was also involved in assisting the sportmaster to

train the students who took part in the National Sports For The Disabled.

New equipment were purchased to upgrade the training programmes for the Cerebral Palsy children. These included an Active-Passive Trainer, Gazelle Standing Frame, Walking Tutor Walker, Kaye Walker and Sir David Brand Walker.

# SPEECH THERAPY

Speech Therapy is divided into 5 areas

- i. Pre-verbal Skills
- ii. Receptive and Expressive Language
- iii. Articulation
- iv. Augmentative Communication
- v. Feeding Skills

The Speech Therapy Department provided service for a total of sixty three children during 1996. The number comprised morning school, preschool, pre-entry, SNU, playgroup and as well as children from Therapy Clients.

This year the Speech Therapy Department focused on the theme "Talk To me, Not For Me". The theme is appropriate as people tends to use middle person to communicate to our children and also tends to talk on behalf of the children.

Hopefully with this theme more and more people will change their attitude and communicate directly to the children.

# OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Occupational Therapy Department extended its service to playgroup (A & B) with children ages ranging from 2 years to 6 years old and also looked into the occupational needs of the Outreach Children in Seberang Perai.

Group activities such as craft and recreational interactive skills were conducted throughout the year. In addition, activity of daily living skills which play a very important role to our Cerebral Palsied children continues.

Individual therapy sessions were given to children who have short concentration span, poor visual motor coordination, poor visual perception, etc.

Progress was noted in all the children who attended the Occupational Therapy programme.

# GIRL GUIDES

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There are 4 girl this year (1996). They participate in various activities such as :-

1. Craft Work - Making gift boxes from used greeting cards, house-shaped containers, craft stick pictures, origami and simple sewing.
2. Social Skills - Singing, story-telling and games sessions; simple cooking skills.
3. Learning girl guide rules, regulations and simple knotting.

# CUBS

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This year 7 members were enrolled into the Cubs movement. Activities such as outings, first aid skills, cooking, camping, craft and art, picnics, participation in social activities and music lessons were planned for them.

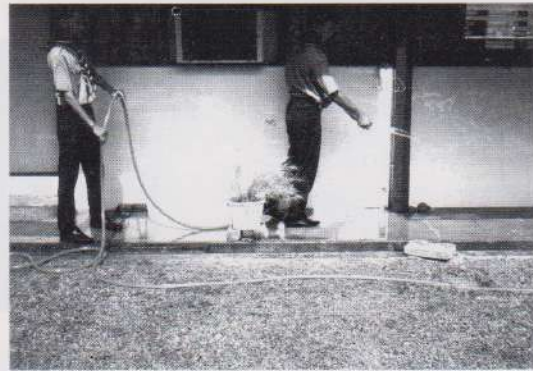

# COMPUTER CLASS

The computer class has successfully ventured into its second year with a consistent number of students. More software and a Macintosh Performa 6200 have been added to meet the demand as well as exposing students to different activities. Among the latest additions are 'My First Incredible Dictionary' which aims to improve vocabulary and 'Thinking Things Collection' which emphasizes auditory discrimination, enhances visual and auditory memory, create, remember and learn visual scanning.

Being able to manipulate the computer easily has really promoted interest among the students. Most of the students are able to choose their favourite activities and play/work independently. We hope the emerging independence will boost their self determination, self confidence and ability to interact well with their peers.

Few students from School Section are able to use application programs such as Microsoft Word and Microsoft Excel. They can operate the programs by using commands from the keyboard as well as from the menu. Immediate visibility of text on the monitor as the writing proceeds; easy corrections of mistakes with no signs of alteration; many text processing facilities such as revise, transfer and delete, at the touch of a key; are among the many reasons why these students are using the programmes.

Overall performance of the students is satisfactory and they have shown remarkable progress such as learning to follow instructions, beginning to respond vocally to actions on the screens and/or to the voice output, improved ability to identify and label pictures, body parts and prepositions. Constant efforts are being made to increase the attention span, to enhance the skill to complete the tasks given with minimum help and to improve communication skills such as signing, vocalizing, eye pointing etc.

Our future plan is to introduce more adaptive technology to enable the students with severe disabilities to have access to computer. We hope in the long run these students will be able to interact with the people around via computer.

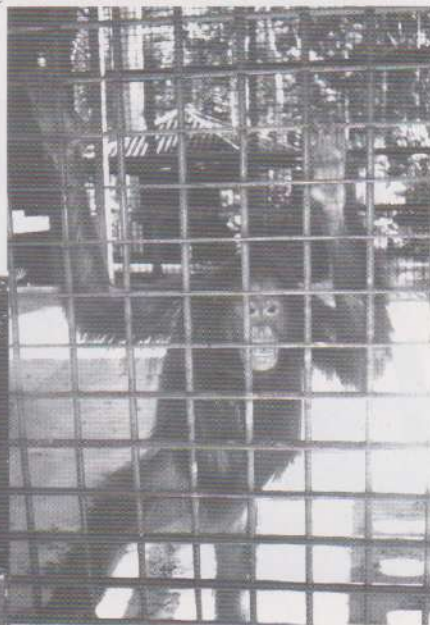

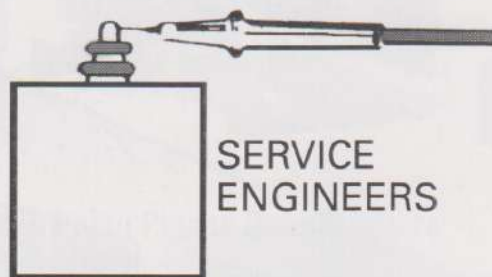


Thanks to the support from the government, corporate and well wishes, our new extension block is now a reality and is in the process of getting the Occupation Certificate (OC).
