

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT



In this striving economy moment, we continue to give Thanks and Praises for God's blessings that our Centre is able to provide free services that were made possible from the kind donors and assistance given by the government in sustaining the Centre since 1962.

We organized yearly fund raising for the Centre and this year *Charity Walk-Jog- Wheel With Us* was in collaboration with the Penang Island City Council (MBPP) and we were faced with challenges due to many state events at the same time. Nevertheless, it was a success and we would like to say a big Thank You to our donors who have never failed to support us.

We have started organic farming last year, and the produce has helped to reduce our expenses in providing free meals for our children, and has also played as an educational platform for the younger children.

Children detected with early signs of Cerebral Palsy conditions have to go through rehabilitative programs in Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy and Occupational Therapy. In academic program, we have qualified and experienced teachers in teaching skills and concept designed according to the child's level of development. Children at our Centre are also exposed to other activities, such as Hydrotherapy, Music, Singing and Sports. We continue to accept new enrolment in each quarter and the numbers have been growing. Cerebral Palsy children need continuous physiotherapy, especially so for those with severe condition. We are excited that next year we can expand our *Aftercare* service to former students' home from the grant received from Yayasan Bursa Malaysia.

2018 was indeed the year of hope and deliverance and we would like to Thank God for hearing our prayers.

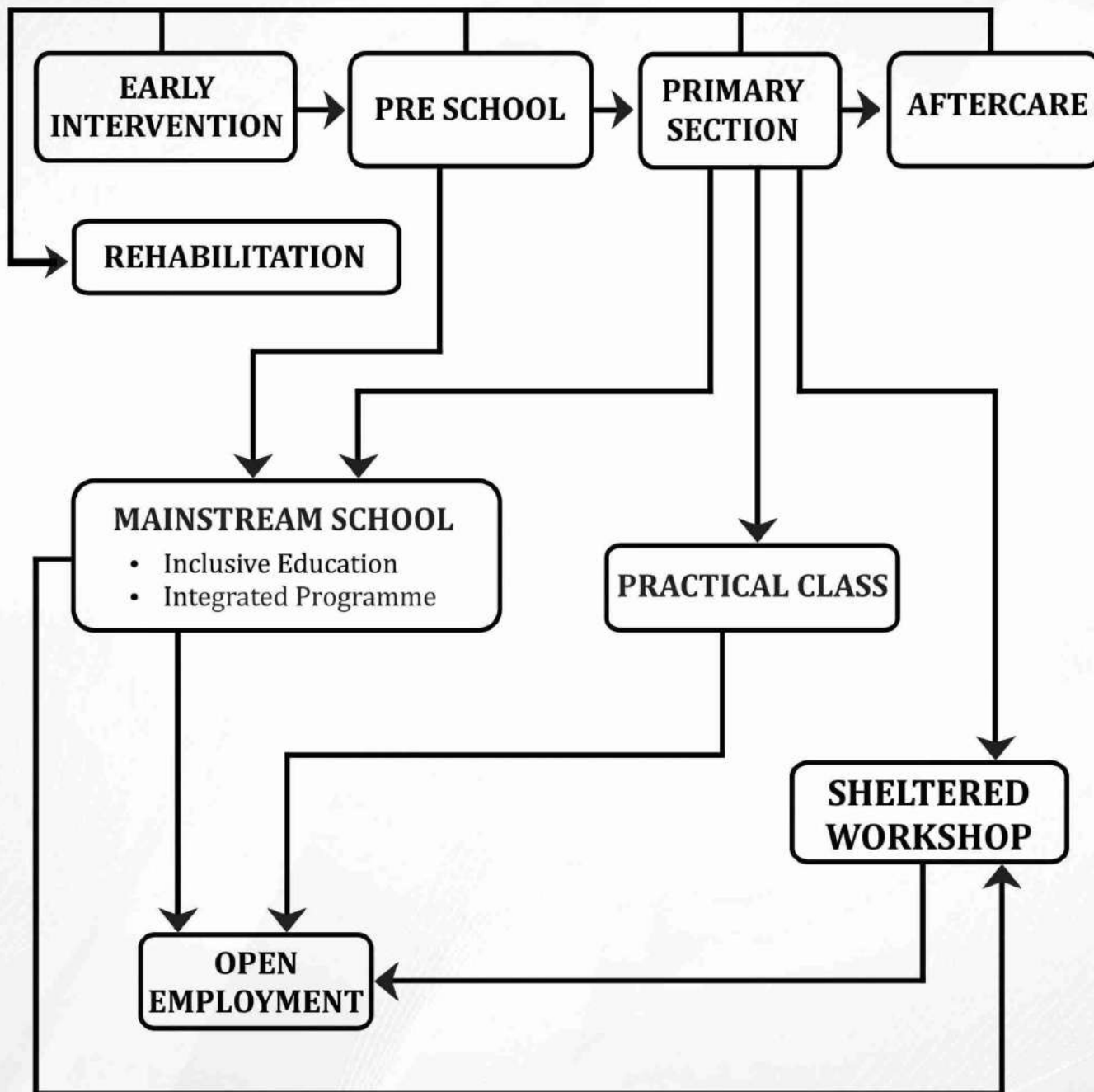

CPCAP's PROGRAM STRUCTURE



At the Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang, we believe education is for ALL. Every child has the right to education, regardless of his/her abilities or disabilities; and all children are educable although they may learn at different rates and level. To facilitate the different learning styles, there is flexibility in the curriculum, modifications and adaptations in the teaching and learning methods.

EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAMME



Activity of daily living “We can do it”

The age range of the children in EIP class is between one month to four years old. A total of 15 children are enrolled in this section where the activities are carried out in the morning and afternoon. We have ten children joining us in the morning and five in the afternoon. We follow the principle of conductive education which emphasizes on daily practical experiences such as functional skills (walking, toileting etc.), activity of daily living, task series (Physical movement) and cognitive skills.

Activities of daily living, also referred to as ADL, are basic tasks of everyday life and they include tasks such as eating, bathing, clothing and toileting. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to carry out the activities at home after observing and participating in the classroom sessions.

The five basic categories of Activities of Daily Living are as follows :

1. Personal hygiene - bathing/ showering, grooming, nail care and oral care
2. Dressing - the ability to make appropriate clothing decisions and physically dress /undress oneself, removing AFO (Ankle Foot Orthosis) , socks and shoes.
3. Eating- the ability to feed oneself, though not necessarily the capability to prepare food.
4. Maintaining continence - both the mental and physical capacity to use a restroom, including the ability to get on and off the toilet and cleaning oneself.
5. Transferring/mobility- moving oneself from seated to standing position getting in and out of bed, and the ability to walk independently from one location to another.

PRESCHOOL

Pre School class has an enrolment of 15 children. They are divided into morning and afternoon session. We follow the conductive education programme which is specifically design for children and adults who have motor disorders. In Conductive education the children are exposed to the learning environment where the child become an active participant on his own, learning how to adapt and adjust to his natural and social environment. In Pre School class the children are given a variety of activities such as learning numbers, colours, reading, walking, jumping and rolling.



Children in their earliest years make learning links in their brains at a faster rate than they will ever do again. The learning for babies and young children is the foundation for everything they later become and it is well known that learning happens effectively in a stimulating environment. Such learning cannot be programmed. It is an organic process where playful and positive exchange of songs, sounds, facial expressions and touches between adults and

children themselves form a basic for skilled communication. Studies show that feelings really matter in developing our young children's learning capabilities. Parents and early years practitioners have a huge privilege, to help to shape the lives of babies and young children. As toddlers develop they become aware of the way in which other people view them and start to behave accordingly. The loving family and key practitioners



have a powerful influence on the child's sense of self. Through their different behaviours these people help the child to know who he is. As the young child goes through the process of establishing his identity he starts to recognize how others see him.

"Each area of learning and development must be implemented through planned, purposeful play and through the mix of adult-lead and child initiated activity. Play is essential for children's development, building their confidence as they learn to explore, to think about problems and relate to others. Children learn by leading their own play by taking part in play which is guided by adults. (Statutory for the early years foundation stage dfe, 2012)"



PRIMARY SECTION Kelas Zamrud



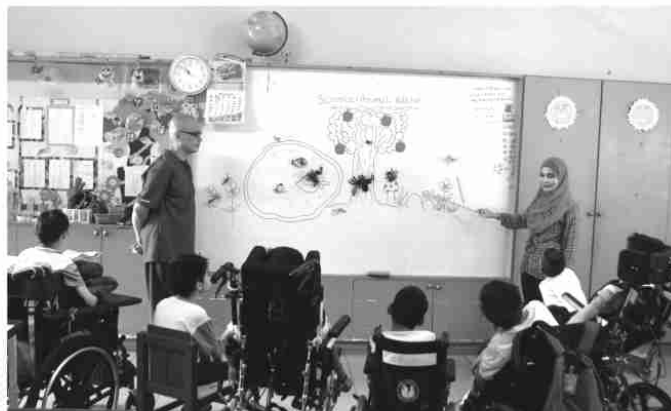
Kelas Zamrud has enrollment of twelve students, five are females and seven are males. Kelas Zamrud uses the regular preschool curriculum with some modification to suit each student. The academic lessons carried out are Bahasa Melayu, English, Mathematics, and Science. Besides that, we also have Moral Studies, Creative Art, Fun Cooking, and Hydrotherapy.



Subject teaching is conducted in a big group and one to one basis. We stress on interactive learning through educational activities. The program in the class are provided to nurture, guide and support the students to reach maximum potential to meet the challenges in life.

Science in the special education classroom can be one of the most interesting subjects to teach and engage the students. Students can do a lot of fun things with it from nature walks to in-class experiments. Science also enhances eye-hand coordination and the cognitive level

of the students. For example in learning of "Animal Habitat" students will be able to understand and identify the different habitats that animals live in. During the science lesson, students are asked to think about what kinds of things animals might need to survive. Explain that animals all live in a natural environment called "habitat" which is what we call the most ideal home for the animal. Then the students are asked to choose an animal that lives in one of the habitats to stick that animal toy on the whiteboard representing its habitat. In conclusion the students gather and match the animals they choose for the habitat. Final assessment would be the teachers distributing a copy of the My Animal Habitat worksheet to each student.



PRIMARY SECTION Kelas Baiduri

Kelas Baiduri has an enrolment of 18 students whereby 15 students attend the morning session and 3 students attend the afternoon session. Kelas Baiduri concentrates more on practical aspects of learning that focuses on functional skills and other activities of daily living.

Basic concepts of shapes, colours and subjects teaching Bahasa Melayu, English, Mathematics, Science and Music and Movement are taught along with

classroom skills. The academically inclined students are exposed to various activities related to sensory stimulation and self-help care.

Gardening has long been regarded as a therapeutic activity. Research has shown that handling different plants and flowers has beneficial affects on both physical and mental health. Now gardening is also widely recognized as a tool to help people with disabilities and special needs to develop vital skills and promote their overall well-being.

Most sports may not be practical for children with certain disabilities. Fortunately, gardening is a worthy alternative. It helps the children improve their motor skills such as balance, body coordination and mobility. Planting can stimulate the muscle as kids will bend, pull, stretch, lift and much more. It can also teach them patience and delayed gratification since plants take time to grow. The fresh air, sunlight, gentle breeze and green plants can have a relaxing effect on them.

PRIMARY SECTION Kelas Jed

Kelas Jed consists of 10 students. The age range of the students is between 11 to 18 years. It is an academic class which provides lower primary education. We use the regular preschool curriculum with some modifications to suit each student and some of the students have been using the standard one level syllabus. The academic lessons carried out are Bahasa Melayu, English, Mathematic, Science and Moral Studies. Besides that the students also get to involve themselves in fun cooking, hydrotherapy and attend computer classes.

Our class vision is to enhance each child's commitment to strive for equal opportunity in achieving better quality life. We have appropriate programmes of instructions and related services designed to meet each child's needs. Our mission is to enhance their cognitive skills and daily living skills in a caring environment and also to encourage full participation in school activities. Teachers are required to achieve the goals set for each child based on the Individualized Educational Plans (IEP). The programmes in the class are carefully planned to cater to the individual needs of each child. The class teachers also play an important role to

cultivate discipline and respectful students.

The picture above shows, a teacher is teaching the students about singular / plural nouns. After the group teaching, the teacher would ask each student to come to the front and write singular and plural words on the white board. Then each child will be assessed using worksheet related to the lesson.

DELL LEARNING CENTER



Nur Sawsan is a 10 year old girl with athetoid cerebral palsy. She has been attending computer classes since she was 10 years old. In the beginning, she was given touchscreen monitor to access the computer. It was not an easy task for her, as she was not able to touch the screen with her finger. It was more like dragging her fist across the monitor. It was quite frustrating for her as she couldn't accurately hit the spot required due to the involuntary movement of her hands.

After some time, Sawsan was allowed to try *Tracker Pro* which is an alternative plug-and-play computer mouse for individuals who are not able to use the regular mouse. The device is placed below the monitor. It reads signal from a reflective dot on her hat or bandana which translates the signal into mouse cursor. With this device, Sawsan only has to move her head to control the mouse movements on the screen.

In the first few months, Sawsan was given more *cause & effect* activities to train her on mouse cursor coordination. Teacher explained to her that the mouse cursor moves as she moves her head. She gradually began to understand the concept. *Dwell Click* which is an application that allows one to use a mouse or other pointing device without clicking buttons was installed for her to type and click on the targeted spots.

Gradually, she acquired the skills and began to use this device with on-screen keyboard during typing activities. In the beginning, she learned to type words from flash cards. It took between one to two minutes for her to locate every letter. It was quite a tiring process as she needed to control her head movement to place the cursor on specific letter and wait for a specific time frame until the mouse click occurs. She showed great improvement in using the device.

Apart from typing activities, she is also being trained to use online activities such as colouring and jigsaw puzzles. In jigsaw puzzles, she learned not only to solve the puzzles but also 'Click-drag-drop' the puzzle.

Sawsan is a very diligent and hard working student. She always tries her level best to complete every task given.



PRACTICAL CLASS

At CPCAP, some of the young adults discharged at the age of nineteen are placed in the Practical Class. This placement is based on their physical abilities and cognitive skills. Most often these young adults with special educational needs face difficulties of adaptation in open employment and social life. We hope with some trainings here, they will acquire some skills to enhance their independence and enable them to get into some gainful employments or businesses, thus avoiding social exclusion. In this class the young adults are trained on many practical tasks such as baking, sewing, cleaning, laundry and gardening. They are assigned the tasks according to their capabilities.

Baking is one of their favourite activities. The trainees are required to name, measure and weigh the ingredients during baking session. We also take orders from the general public and small businesses for buns and cupcakes. This in a way helps to sustain the bakery as well. Parents participation during the baking session is very good. As part of their work training, after each baking session the trainees are required to do all the cleaning, wiping, sweeping and mopping and taught to maintain the cleanliness of the place at all times.

Some trainees who took up needle work learned to make patch blankets and some were given tasks like cutting clothes and tearing sponges for chair backs and pillows. They used laundry machine with supervision to wash blankets, recycled clothes, clothes and soft toys. Apart from that, they learned to dry and pick the clothes, curtains and do hot and cold ironing.

Gardening is another fruitful activity. The trainees are supervised during weeding and watering. Now we are growing a variety of vegetables and the harvest from this garden are used to cook food for the students and the trainees.

SHELTERED WORKSHOP

There are currently seven trainees at Sheltered Workshop. It provides work opportunities for persons with special needs aged 21 and above. There are four main areas of work that are interchangeable :

- Gardening
- Contracted work from local factories
- A recycle project with the support of the local community
- In-house handmade crafts and basketry



Gardening

Some trainees from Sheltered Workshop are actively involved in the gardening. They combine force with Practical Class to do some gardening. The trainees are able to work together and understand each other's duties very well. Among the vegetables planted are Brazilian Spinach, lemon grass, ladies finger, curry leaves, mint and brinjal. The harvest from this garden is used to cook for the students and the trainees.

Contracted work

Contracted work from I.R.M industries continues as usual. The trainees are assigned to clean the Integrated Circuit anti-static plastic tubes. As part of their job, they have to remove the stickers and rubber stopper plugs from the plastic tubes.

Recycle

The recycle program which was started a few years ago has begun to gain momentum with more supports from the community. Among the things we accept for recycling are empty cans/plastic containers, newspapers, old clothing and disused electric items. The trainees are able to identify and segregate the items accordingly before selling to recycle centre.



Crafts

Apart from the above, we also make and sell baskets in various sizes. Handmade crafts such as postcards and notebooks made from recycled papers. These items are usually sold during various charity events throughout the year. Sometimes we have visitors buying the items directly from the workshop.

Overall the trainees are able to work together and understand each other's duties and responsibilities at work. They feel very proud to do the tasks assigned for them.

BUKIT MERTAJAM OUTREACH BRANCH



The Outreach Branch which is currently located in a rented premise at Sekolah Sinar Harapan, Bukit Mertajam caters for the needs of the students from the mainland. This outreach branch operates from Monday to Friday. Our objectives are to improve cognitive skills, sensorial enhancement and improve self care through activities of daily living. The academic programme is based on regular preschool curriculum with some modifications to meet the requirement of each student. Physical activities such as mat task series too are incorporated as part of our daily activities. Therapy services such as physiotherapy and speech & language therapy too are provided for the students. Annual outing is organized at least once a year, not only to provide all students an experience outside their everyday activities but also to improve social and functional skills among them. This outing also facilitates interaction between teachers, parents and the students.

Teh Yong Jian is a 18-year-old student with spastic athetoid. Yong Jian is an intelligent student and shows great interest in learning. He has shown a lot of improvements especially in the areas related to fine and gross motor skills. During the mat task series, emphasis is more on body balancing and weight shifting. Though he has gravitational insecurity, he is able to walk independently with supervision.

He has better left hand coordination compared to the right hand. Yong Jian is able to grasp and release independently with both hands. Though he is able to hold a pencil independently, he needs some assistance to make a proper grasp. His understanding of language is good. He is able to comprehend spoken language in Mandarin and Bahasa Malaysia and little bit in English. He is able to read and write in Bahasa Malaysia, English and Mandarin. He is encouraged to engage in conversation and talk with teacher and his friends about various topics, which also includes social, television programme and about daily routine. He is still a passive conversationalist, but we are doing our best to encourage him in this area.

Yong Jian is good at computer. He uses computer mainly to type his class works and also to surf for information. He has shown consistent progress and acquired some relevant computer skills which are very helpful for him.



SPEECH THERAPY

The speech therapy department provides therapy services that are family-centered and delivered using evidence-based approaches. Our objective is to enhance the capabilities of families to meet the needs of children with cerebral palsy in feeding, speech, language and communication. Clinical assessment is carried out for the children in full details. The therapist and the parents have discussion together to set the realistic goals for the children. Currently, the speech therapy department provides

therapy services for 85-90 children at the Penang Centre and Bukit Mertajam Branch.

Nia Natasha is a seven years old girl who is attending preschool section in our school. She has acquired basic understanding of language. However, she is a nonverbal child and has difficulties in learning spoken language. Thus, Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) method has been introduced to her to fulfill her communication needs.

Makaton Hand Signs is one of the AAC methods that we are teaching her. Makaton Hand Signs is designed based on native signs and gestures as well as *Kod Tangan Bahasa Malaysia (KTBM)*. It has selected list of everyday words which is commonly used in daily life, e.g. "eat", "drink", "sleep", "toilet", "good morning", "thank you" etc. She learns to perform the Makaton Hand Signs to name her family members, to greet her teachers, to ask for food or drinks from mother, etc. Beside Makaton Hand Signs, she has been trained to use an AAC app in Ipad named "LetMeTalk". "LetMeTalk" is a speech generated app which supports communication and provides a voice for individuals with speech difficulties. It contains pictures that can be used in various situations and places. When a picture is selected, "LetMeTalk" app will provide a voice that speaks for the user. For example, when I asked Natasha "what is your favourite food?" she selected the picture "pizza" and the app spoke for her. Combination of Makaton Hand Signs



and Ipad AAC app "LetMeTalk" will help her to express effectively and build up her confidence in communication.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY



Currently occupational therapy department is providing therapy for 68 children from Monday to Friday. Our objective is to make the children engage in hand function activities independently.

During the play therapy session Koay Jia Jun, 8 year old boy, Chuah Han Wei, 13 year old boy and Nur Sawsan, 10 year old girl were involved in play dough activity which improves their fine motor skills especially in squishing, squashing, rolling, pinching, grasping and flattening the dough. These fine motor activities will help them in prewriting skills such as holding a pencil, cutting with a scissor and able to do hand manipulation activity.

This activity gives a soothing effect on them. It also allows them to creatively use their imaginations during dough play. It also enhances the students' social skills and improves eye hand coordination. The pleasant smell from the essences used in play dough engages the students in the activity and allows the exploration of other senses as well.

PHYSIOTHERAPY



Facilitation from lying to side sitting ; Training 'weight bearing' in side sitting position

Aim of physiotherapy is to help the children with Cerebral Palsy to achieve maximum possible independence in functional skills. The therapist helps the child to change the abnormal posture and movement, so he or she can easily adapt to the changes in the environment and develop better quality of functional skills. Children at the centre are provided therapy once or twice a week. Currently, we are providing therapy for 93 children in the centre. Physiotherapy is also provided twice monthly on Saturdays for ex-pupils and children attending the mainstream schools.

Joanne Ngoh Pei Sing is a 4 years old charming girl. She has been attending Early Intervention Programme since 2016. She is **attending** physiotherapy twice a week. Initially she was not cooperative during the therapy sessions but over the time with some motivation, she is beginning to cooperate and take initiative to do her exercises.

In the beginning, Joanne had difficulties in maintaining head, neck and upper limbs in the midline orientation during lying, sitting and standing positions. She was not able to sit maintaining trunk extension due to her poor trunk stability and weak proximal muscle. She was also standing on her toes with scissoring legs due to increased tone and muscle tightness.

Currently she is able to roll from supine to side lying. She can come to side sitting by maintaining head and neck in midline with very minimal assistance. Joanne also can reach out and take objects while in side sitting; and able to maintain head, neck and upper limb in midline while in sitting position for 60 seconds and can stand using AFO with moderate support at hip and trunk.

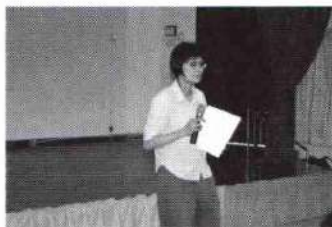

Mr. Foong See Yoke who passed away on Wednesday, 14 February 2018 was the 9th Honorary Secretary of the Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang (CPCAP). He was appointed as the Supervisor of Special Education of Penang in January 1985. In early 1985, he joined the Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang Board of Management as a representative of the Director of Education in Penang. After his retirement from the government, he was invited to stay on with the Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang Board of Management to help our students especially the less severe cases to enter mainstream schools.

In 1990, Mr. Foong See Yoke was appointed as the Executive Administrator of the Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang but he resigned in April 1991. In the year 1993, he was elected as the Honorary Secretary of Cerebral Palsy (Spastic) Children's Association of Penang, and he remained in that capacity until he relinquished the position in 2010. He remained as an active member of the Management Committee till his passing away.

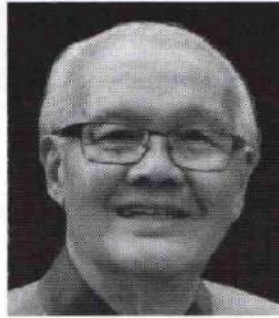
He once recalled when a newspaper reporter asked him, "Mr. Foong, since you you have been with CPCAP for over 20-years, do you feel sad working with children with cerebral palsy? He replied, "No! On the contrary, I feel happy working with these very special children. They really inspire me to do more for them and this reminded me of a poem by William Wordsworth in Ode to Immortality":

Thanks to human heart by which we live
Thanks to its tenderness its joys and fears
To me this meaner flower their blooms can give
Thoughts that do often lie too deep for tears.
